

Is my child too ill for school?

School attendance is so important for children's success and we want to see them in school as much as possible! However, as the weather turns cooler we know that some illness can't be avoided. This guide below taken from the NHS website (<u>https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/</u>) will help make the decision. We will always contact you if we feel they are too unwell to attend.

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with a minor <u>cough</u> or <u>common cold</u>. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

High temperature

If your child has a high temperature (38 degrees or more), keep them off school until it goes away.

Chickenpox

If your child has <u>chickenpox</u>, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Cold sores

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a <u>cold sore</u>. Encourage them not to touch the blister or kiss anyone while they have the cold sore, or to share things like cups and towels.

Conjunctivitis

You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have <u>conjunctivitis</u>. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.

What to do if your child has tested positive

Your child is no longer required to do a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test if they have symptoms. If they feel well enough (minor cold symptoms) then they can come into school.

Hand, foot and mouth disease

If your child has hand, foot and mouth disease but seems well enough to go to school, there's no need to keep them off.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues straight away and to wash their hands regularly.

Head lice and nits

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice. You can treat head lice and nits without seeing a GP.

Sore throat

You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat.

Vomiting and diarrhoea

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).


